New Initiatives to Elevate University Talent Program

We have pursued groundbreaking initiatives to elevate our university talent program to unprecedented heights. By broadening our student audience, enhancing talent engagement activities, and fostering deeper connections with university and community stakeholders, we have charted a transformative path. Notably, our trailblazing "Ready to Work" Program and San Diego STEM Inter-Collegiate Collective have addressed the crucial gap between academic preparation and workplace performance, equipping tech college graduates with vital and essential skills for success.

In Fall 2022, we launched the pilot "Ready to Work" Program with the inaugural cohort composed of:

- Number of students: 23
- Participating colleges: CSUSM, SDSU, UCSD, USD, San Diego City College and Southwestern College
- Class statuses: juniors, seniors and graduate students
- Majors: bioengineering, computer science, data science, electrical engineering, management information systems, mechanical engineering and physics
