
Inter-Collegiate Approach

Peter Ellsworth, Legler Benbough Foundation - Legler Benbough provided early seed funding for the JTI and Peter was a mentor and helped to guide the JTI to where it is today.

Tom Clancy, Tom was one of the founders of Tech San Diego and an early thought leader on the formation of the JTI.

Robert Akins, Former CEO Cymer, Bob planted the seeds of the JTI many years ago by approaching the executive director of Tech San Diego and saying 'Tech San Diego is missing out by not collaborating with regional universities'.
